Take a lot of shots. The more shots you take, the greater your chance of getting the image you really like. Simply delete those you don't like to free up storage space.

To change the feel of mode in you image, consider shooting in a different color mode. Many cameras, including my Olympus C-3030, offer color, black and white or sepia-tone options.

Have fun with you digital images. Share them with friends and family through e-mail or post them on a website. Manipulate your photos with special effect or filters with an imaging software program.

Invest in rechargeable batteries and a battery charger. This is a wise investment that will save money in the long run.

To help conserve battery power on you digital camera, use an AC adapter when reviewing images on the LCD or when downloading images to a computer.

Get to know your camera's capabilities and imaging software packaged with it. The more you know, the more you can use your camera to its full potential.

Digital Corner

Digital Resolution

Think of resolution as your benchmark guide to image size and sharpness. **The higher the resolution, the bigger and sharper a print you can make.** Here's a key concept to master in your search for the right camera: The all let you select from *several different* resolutions, from maximum (a 3.3MP image gives an almost 8x10-inch print at 300 pixel per square inch) to Web-size.

Remember: you can always scale down a large digital photo file in your software image editor without loss of image quality. Scaling up lower "res" images means you lose quality (unless you use a specialized software image scaler such as Genuine Fractals (www.genuinefractals.com) or MrSID (www.lizardtech.com), which works beautifully).

Photo Sharing Sites

There are as many flavors and styles of Internet photo sharing and processing out there as drivers using cell phones on the Illinois toll way. Many are free or only charge for add-on services, such as keeping images online for more than 30 day after initial processing. The best way to know one is right for you is to jump on your Web browser and give them a look. Here are some to start with:

Unique 3D Page-Flipping Albums

FlipAlbum from e-book will let you instantly created digital photo albums which look and feel like a real photo album. With the easy to use interface, you can create cool 3D animated page-flipping album in minutes. Viewing you creation with the automated slideshow feature and Autoflip functions allows for hands-free picture viewing. You can annotate, resize and open multiple albums to manage your photos.

You can download a free limited version of FlipAlbum from www.flipalbum.com/m14, or purchase FlipAlbum or FlipAlbum Suite (which includes FlipAlbum CD Maker) online. FlipAlbum sells for \$39.95 and the Suite for \$57.95.

Getting Organized

...With Software That Acts As A Digital Photo Assistant To Keep Your Image Files In Line

In the old days, we stored our photos in a shoebox, a dresser drawer of some combination thereof. Now we can keep files on one hard drive or another, burn them to CDs, store them on removable disk such as Zip and Jaz or even stick'em up on the Web. Yikes!

I can break your options into three primary categories: viewing, album creation, and cataloging. The option that I use most is viewing therefore, my favorite program for this is **ACD See 30**. ACD See provides instant viewing of your image files with thumbnails and color-coded file information as soon as you click on the folder. Upon opening, it shows image file in any selected folder, as well as description and any additional information that can be set by the user. With an interface modeled after a traditional Windows file tree, ACD See has a straightforward feel that I like and appreciate. ACD See retails for \$49.95 and you can download a fully functioning version from www.acdsystems.com.

Windows 95 Tips

WinFiles Vs Bugs

You don't have to upgrade to Windows 98 or later just to fix problems in your Windows 95. Nor do you have to depend on Microsoft's Web site for updates. You can turn to other sites such as CNET's WinFiles.com [<http://winfiles.cnet.com/bugs>]. This has downloads and service packs for Win 95 and later versions of Windows, most of them entirely free.

Phone Dialer Log

The Phone Dialer Log can show you all of the incoming and outgoing calls made through the Dialer. Unless someone has set it to log only certain types of calls. Through the Call Log window, you can choose the Log Menu and then Options. Here you can choose to only track incoming, only outgoing, or both kinds of calls.

50 Fonts

Ideally, you shouldn't have any more than 50 fonts in the main FONTS folder. Any more than that seriously hurts performance. Even 50 fonts means slower operation and fewer resources for other programs than, say, 30 or 20 fonts.

If you want more fonts you should keep the others in separate folders. You can use the Control Panel for Fonts to choose which fonts are in your system.

WINDOWS 98 TIPS

UNINSTALLING DESKTOP THEMES

While they look interesting and break the monotony of the standard Windows 98 interface, Desktop Themes are also a bit of a space hog. If you have no need for quirky Recycling Bins and pointers that look like paintbrushes, you're better off uninstalling the Desktop Themes that you'll never use (you can always add them back later from your Windows 98 installation CD-ROM). To uninstall specific Desktop Themes, go to Start, Settings, Control Panel and double-click the Desktop Themes icon. You can preview any theme from the drop-down menu at the top of the screen. If you see one you'll never use, simply click the Delete button to remove it from your system.

OPENING DOWNLOADED FILES AUTOMATICALLY

You can configure Windows 98 to open downloaded files automatically when the download is complete, saving you the trouble of opening the file yourself. The trick is to set the file type (see the note below) to open automatically in the Folder Options. Go to Start, Settings, Folder Options, and click the File Types tab. In the list, find the file type you're looking for, click on it once, and click the Edit button. Check the Confirm Open After Download box and click OK. The next time you download a file of this type, Windows will automatically open the file when the download completes.

Note: Be careful about choosing which files to set up for automatic running. Microsoft Word files, for example, can contain macro viruses that could be spread when they are opened. It's best to save document and executable files that could have viruses to disk, and then scan them with your anti-virus software before opening them. But this technique can be a good choice for other file types, such as image or audio.

DISPLAYING SPECIFIC FILE EXTENSIONS

File extensions are those three-letter suffixes attached to all files that let your computer know what kind of file it's dealing with. Most users like to keep their extensions hidden, if only for aesthetic purposes, not wanting to clutter their desktop and folders with unnecessary text. But you should know that displaying file extensions is not an either/or proposition; you can choose to display file extensions for only specific kinds of files. If, for example, you always want to know whenever a given file is a text file (with the extension .txt), you can choose to display the extension for that type only.

Go to Start, Settings, Folder Options, and click the File Types tab. Select the file type you wish to modify (in our example, Text Document) and click the Edit tab. Check the Always Show Extension box, and then click OK twice.

DOWNLOADING MICROSOFT REGCLEAN

Many people have a steady stream of applications coming and going on their computer. Maybe you like to check out the latest shareware and freeware programs, and then you uninstall them when their licenses run out. If you're constantly installing and uninstalling applications, there's a chance that your Windows Registry is a bit bloated, the result of programs not performing their uninstall routines properly. When programs fail to remove all their information from the Registry upon uninstall, the Registry file becomes cluttered with "dead" information, which can slow down access to it. Microsoft makes a program that can look at your Registry and suggest ways to make it leaner. You can get more information about RegClean and download it at

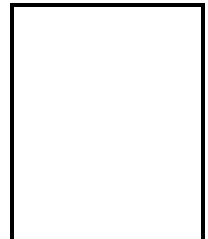
