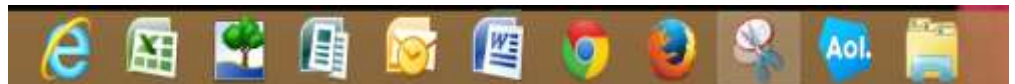

I am still trying to find ways to make Windows 8 work faster. Do you have icons on your taskbar? If you do, there is a way to make them launch very quickly. My taskbar:



As you can see, going from left to right, Internet Explorer is the first icon. If I want to launch Internet Explorer quickly, I hit the Windows key  and the numeral 1, and voilà, I have launched it. To open Excel, you hit the Windows key  and numeral 2. I used the snipping tool to copy the taskbar by hitting

What most didn't know is that there is a free ICE app available for Androids, iPhones, Windows phones, etc. It provides space for contacts, information, notes, and settings. Question: I have just returned from my vacation and cannot connect to the internet. I have a wireless system and am using my new laptop. Can you help?

Answer: One of the most common causes for not being able to connect wirelessly to the internet is that the settings in Internet Explorer have changed or have been changed to "Dialup." This happens when you have been using "dialup" in another location and have not changed it back when you returned to use "broadband." It could also happen if malware has infiltrated your computer.

To check if this is the problem, follow the steps below: With Internet Explorer open click on "Tools." Choose "Internet Options" from the drop down box. Click on the "Connections Tab" and make sure that "Never dial a connection" is checked. Click OK.

Question: If I cannot close my computer using the Start Button or my computer freezes, is it OK to pull the plug?

Answer: No, it is not advisable to "pull the plug" if your computer freezes. The "shock" of pulling the plug on a working computer could cause the hard drive to crash or malfunction.

The safe way to close down the computer is to hold down the CTRL, ALT and DELETE keys simultaneously, which will bring up the Window's Task Manager. This "tool" allows you to close the troublesome program or programs and then continue working on your computer without closing down your system.

Question:

I've received questions about the cost, if any, to upgrade to Windows 8.1.

Basically, with some exceptions, if you own Windows 8, then you can upgrade to 8.1 with no cost.

To upgrade from a version of Windows earlier than Windows 8.0, you must buy Windows 8.1.

Here are some of the exceptions on the "free upgrade" from Windows 8.0 to 8.1 per HP:

** Not all Windows 8.1 features may be available when updating to Windows 8.1 from Windows 8



PCs. Your system may require additional hardware, drivers, software, firmware, and/or a BIOS update. Upgrading between operating system editions, e.g. from Windows 8 (non Pro) to Windows 8.1 Pro and Media Center will incur additional fees. Recipe of the Month

Let's make
pickles!!!!

1. If you don't have plenty of small cucumbers in your garden, buy a few pounds at the local farmer's market or grocery.

2. Wash out a large glass jar.

3. Put 10 cloves of garlic, peeled and slightly crushed in the bottom of the jar.



4. Stuff in pickles either whole or sliced so the jar is nearly full.

5. Put a hefty bunch of Dill on top, or use dill seed.

6. Fill the jar COMPLETELY with a 50/50 mixture of water and vinegar. White vinegar is fine, but apple vinegar gives a little different flavor.

7. Put on the lid and shake the jar a little.

8. Put the jar in the refrigerator and wait 1 week before eating those home-made pickles!!!!

****Don't throw out the liquid after the pickles are eaten. You can use it again for cucumbers or add broccoli or cauliflower.
