# Phily Prily Ramblings



In case you did not receive my earlier Google Groups LCACE email, I am sad to report that William "Bill" Fosdick passed away suddenly in late November. He and DeBorah Sirilla have been regulars at our monthly meetings, and hosted our 2016 LCACE picnic at a Vernon Hills Park District location. Bill was an active participant at our meetings, often supplying answers to technical issues that came up and offering constructive suggestions for future action. He was also a major financial supporter for our club through his advocacy for our monthly 50/50 raffle and high ticket sales for our Holiday Party raffles. His contributions, sense of humor and personality will be missed by all!

A recent How-To Geek newsletter included an article about why rebooting your router fixes many problems with your Internet connection. If you are like me, and have experienced Wi-Fi slowdowns, pauses or crashes, I encourage you to check this out. Here's the link: https://www.howtogeek.com/165110/do-i-really-have-to-unplug-my-cable-modem-for-at-least-10-seconds/.

Moreover, this article contains links to other How-To Geek articles devoted to different aspects of this very important component in your home network. One offers simple fixes to Wi-Fi "dead zones" (moving your router and avoiding interference from other devices in your home and/or your neighbors' Wi-Fi networks). Another explains why you should consider upgrading your router, even if you are using older devices in your network (reduced interference, better coverage, improved security, updated software, automatic updating and specialty features).

However, while you are mulling over all this advice about your router and home network, do not forget two crucial actions to take now to protect yourself against intrusion by bad guys and keep your current router operating as effectively as possible. The first is to ensure that you have updated the internal login information in your router from the "admin/admin" combination that it probably came with when you first installed it. If you haven't done this, simply re-visit the set-up instructions that came with your router, visit the manufacturer's website or do an online search for a step-by-step process. A new, longer and stronger router password will help to keep the bad guys at bay.

The second is to be sure that your router's internal software / firmware is up to date. If your router model is several years old, chances are that

the manufacturer has created one or more updates to improve performance and/or security. (For the purposes of this discussion please note that we are talking about the age of the model itself, not when you happened to buy your device.) Newer router models (and models typically rented to you by a cable Internet provider) may include an automatic update feature. If you have a router that falls into one of these categories, you should verify that this is the case for your model. If so, no worries. If not, or if you have an older model, visit the manufacturer's website to see if there are updates for your router. If so, follow the manufacturer's instructions to download and install those updates.

The How-To Geek website offers quite a few articles devoted to different aspects of your home network. Just go to www.howtogeek.com and post your search query. Ditto for other aspects of your personal computing. And, of course, the Internet offers a huge number of such tips – some better than others. (The benefit of starting your search on a website you trust – such as How-To Geek – is that you are likely to (1) quickly find what you are looking for; (2) have a higher confidence level that you are getting good advice.)

On a separate note, I have been asked to give a presentation about "Digital Afterlife" at the Waukegan Township Park Place Senior Center at 1:00 pm on Wednesday, December 13<sup>th</sup>. 
